

# Genesis 1 (NIV)

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.<sup>2</sup> Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters.

<sup>3</sup> And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light... <sup>5</sup> God called the light "day," and the darkness He called "night." And there was evening, and there was morning—the first day.

<sup>6</sup> And God said, "Let there be an expanse between the waters to separate water from water."... <sup>8</sup> God called the expanse "sky." And there was evening, and there was morning—the second day.

<sup>9</sup> And God said, "Let the water under the sky be gathered to one place, and let dry ground appear." ... <sup>11</sup> Then God said, "Let the land produce vegetation:... according to their various kinds." And it was so. ... And God saw that it was good. <sup>13</sup> And there was evening, and there was morning—the third day.

- <sup>14</sup> And God said, "Let there be lights in the expanse of the sky to separate the day from the night, and let them serve as signs to mark sacred times, and days and years... And God saw that it was good. <sup>19</sup> And there was evening, and there was morning—the fourth day.
- <sup>20</sup> And God said, "Let the water teem with living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the expanse of the sky."... And God saw that it was good. <sup>23</sup> And there was evening, and there was morning—the fifth day.
- <sup>24</sup> And God said, "Let the land produce living creatures according to their kinds: ... And God saw that it was good.
- <sup>26</sup> Then God said, "Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness, so that they may rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky, over the livestock and all the wild animals, and over all the creatures that move along the ground."


So God created mankind in His own image, in the image of God He created them; male and female He created them.


#### Genesis 2

- He is Jehovah Jireh


