## 24 FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

**Q1** Where is the nearest Civil Defence registration centre to my home?

**A1** Normally it's the nearest school. If you are unsure, check with your local Civil Defence Officer, Chuck Davis, at Waipa District Council.

**Q2** What do I need for my Civil Defence survival kit?

**A2** In August 1999, the Y2K Readiness Commission released to every New Zealand household a brochure listing all the things you need (if you didn't get one, see the cut out below)

**Q3** What do I do in the event of power failure?

**A3** For heating and cooking, use a camping gas cooker (or bbq). For lighting, use candles and/or torches. Children should be supervised to avoid fire dangers

**Q4** How long are essential services likely to be down for?

**A4** Allow for about 4 hours of power and telephone disruption and about 8 hours for water. The Y2K Readiness Commission believes New Zealanders should prepare for the possibility of interruptions lasting up to 3 days. Interruptions could occur anytime from 31 December 1999 to 31 March 2000 and are likely to be localised and of short duration. But because there are no guarantees prepare for three days and stay prepared for three months.

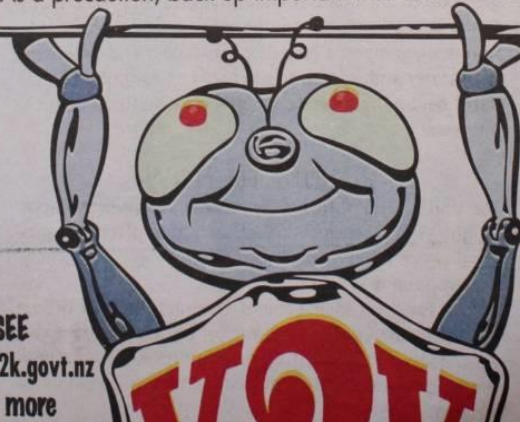

## Your Y2K B Ready Kit Checklist

- Canned, non perishable food (allow for up to 3 days)
- Bottled Water (at least 3 litres for each person per day)
- BBQ or Gas Primus (to cook on if power has failed - and don't forget matches or lighters). Keep safe from children
  - Medicines (prescribed and general - e.g. Panadol)
- Torch and batteries, candles, light sticks (caution: keep safe from children)
  - Radio and Batteries
- Hygiene: toilet paper, plastic bags, bucket and disinfectant
- As a precaution, back up important files on home computers

**Q23** If a life-threatening situation arises should I call?

**A23** Call 111 for Emergency Services (as normal)

**Q24** Will my home appliances be affected?

**A24** If you are concerned, you should contact the retailer or manufacturer

Only a few household goods are likely to be affected, some of those that have time date functions, and they are likely to have minor problems rather than stop working together.

So you needn't worry about your vacuum cleaner, dishwashers, washing machines, blenders, makers, microwaves, telephones, dryers, smoke alarms, television, even cars and motor bikes. Your hair dryer certainly won't be affected. If you are concerned, you should contact the retailer or manufacturer

What food should I use first and how long will it last in my freezer?

Use all perishable foods first. Fresh food should be used first, then the food in your freezer. Food in your freezer should last between 24 - 36 hours if you do not open the freezer door.
